Detective Matthew Briscoe, shield 01658 of the 001 Detective Squad, states as follows:

On December 26, 2006, at about 15:00 hours inside of 84 West Broadway in the County and State of New York, the Defendant committed the offenses of:

1. PL120.00(1) Assault in the Third Degree (1 count)
2. PL120.00(2) Assault in the Third Degree (1 count)
3. PL110/120.00(1) Attempted Assault in the Third Degree (1 count)
4. PL240.26(1) Harassment in the Second degree (1 count)

the defendant, with intent to cause physical injury to another person, caused such injury to another person; the defendant recklessly caused physical injury to another person; the defendant, with intent to cause physical injury to another person, attempted to cause such injury to another person; and the defendant, with intent to harass, annoy and alarm another, subjected that person to physical contact and attempted and threatened to do the same.

The offenses were committed under the following circumstances:

Deponent is informed by Edward Hatchett, of an address known to the District Attorney's Office, that (i) informant observed defendant repeatedly strike informant with a closed fist about the face and neck; (ii) said actions knocked informant to the ground; (iii) while informant was on the ground, defendant repeatedly kicked informant in the ribs and torso; and (iv) said actions caused informant to sustain injuries, to wit: lacerations to informant's face and neck, contusions, and substantial pain.

False statements made herein are punishable as a class A misdemeanor pursuant to section 210.45 of the penal law.
